Georgia Strait is a spectacular inland sea that is home to thousands of species of birds, plants and animals. Local communities depend on the Strait for income, transportation, recreation and quality of life. These waters support aboriginal, sports and commercial fishing and they attract tourists from all over the world. But Parks Canada calls it the “most at-risk natural environment in Canada”. More than 125 species are at risk in the Salish Sea area, including the beloved southern resident Orca whales.
