## **Candidate: Michelle Connerty**

Riding: Township of Langley

1. Many communities don't know how much climate change is costing them at present, and will cost in the future. Will you commit to putting systems in place to identify and track those costs?

Yes, absolutely. Deforestation and increased impermeable surface resulting in aquafers not having the same ability to recharge will increase water costs for our municipality. Flooding as a result of higher fresh-it along the Fraser River will increase our Emergency Responder costs and erode land. Global change in weather patterns increasing the chance of catastrophic storms and weather events will also increase our costs.

2. Will you work to develop and implement climate adaptation plans to reduce the harm that climate change causes in your community? How will you fund climate adaptation?

Yes I will. I would be a strong advocate for the following:

- green roofs
